5. Rookley A37 Bridleway upgrade:

TT and GW walked with three Rookley Parish Council Councillors and the secretary along the bridleway. We outlined our vision and explained how the project could go forward. This was helped by having Ken Fry, the surveyor there, who had a grasp on some of the more technical issues. Ken will talk to some of his colleagues to look at ways to minimise some of the surveying costs.

6. Island Green Link / West Wight Greenway:

Several members of the committee met with Pete Fellows who is the IWC lead on this project. Some initial planning work has begun on the West Wight Greenway and the route to Wootton. IWC are still waiting to have final confirmation from HMG. The Dept of Levelling Up has been dissolved and responsibility now lies with the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government. The original bid was submitted two years ago and so costings as well as government priorities have changed. The new government has supported active travel so it is hoped that the plans will be allowed to proceed and the necessary adjustments to costings will be acceptable. It is not known if the upcoming budget is slowing proceedings. It was resolved to write to both MPs to ask them to expedite matters with the appropriate minister. ### TT ###
